- Q.5(B) Reduce the following passage to one third of the original length with suitable title. (10)
 Prohibition creates certain difficult problems. The first problem is unemployment. In Andhra, Bengal and Assam there are lakhs of people engaged in the production of Tari, a kind of intoxicating drink. In the event of introducing complete prohibition in these states all these men would be thrown of their source of earning livelihood. Then there is the toughest problem to check illicit manufacture and sale of intoxicating drink. The report of the all India prohibition committee revealed the fact that in most of the dry areas there have been 'flood of illicit wine'. In the city of Bombay alone illicit wine of the value of fifty lakhs a year had been consumed. It is a pity and a matter of disgrace, too, to note that police and excise officials and their staff, deputed to make the scheme a success, most miserably abuse their basic functions.
